

A Prize of 2,500 € will reward the author of a highly valued scientific memoir on a subject related to port economy, management, techniques or maritime transport in general, and applicable to overseas countries in particular.

Yearly Competitions 2019-2020

Studies must reach the Academy's secretariat by March 1, at the latest. Each award-winning work in the yearly competition is granted a prize of 2,500 € The author of the award-winning work will be conferred the title of "Prizewinner of the Royal Academy for Overseas Sciences".

Questions for the 2019 Competition

A study is requested on the vitality of autochtonous traditions in the contemporary global world.

A research is requested on the impact of urbanization, agricultural and/or industrial development on natural ecosystems in tropical countries, in particular with regard to their ecosystem services and their biodiversity. The research can be limited to one of the causes (urbanization, agricultural or industrial development) and/or to one of the consequences (ecosystem services or biodiversity).

A study is requested on the technical, scientific or economic implication of emerging countries to the collecting and recycling of residues containing metals.

Questions for the 2020 Competition

An anthropological study is requested dealing with the transformation of gender relationships in the present context of economic change in an overseas area.

A study is requested on the impact of climate change in the tropics on ecosystem services (see UN Millennium Ecosystem assessment and IPBES Global Assessment on biodiversity and ecosystems services), being part of provisioning, regulating or supporting services.

A study is requested on the management of the food, water, and energy nexus for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals in emerging countries.
